





Bespoke colourful banners celebrate Ramadan in Turnpike Lane, created and installed with the support of the London Islamic Cultural Society.




A New Mural for Wood Green Library by Artist Anna Nicolo

History Month.




#### Noel Park Big Local Mark 140 Years of The Noel Park Estate



#### Wood Green's Open Air Art Gallery












#### **Growing Back Greener at Sky City**


### Caxton Gardens Upgrades


#### Co-designing a Vision for Wood Green Common

#### Noel Park Big Local Transforming Russell Park



A collaborative partnership between Haringey Council and Noel Park Big Local has enabled the community to create an ambitious and transformative plan for Russell Park - paid for by funds raised by Noel Park Big Local from Local Trust. Stage One of the building works should be completed by Summer 2024 and will be a complete revamp of the junior playground, providing new play equipment that will encourage independent play, sensory play, and young girls play. The project has been designed with input from local people and park users, by a community-appointed architect.

Haringey Council's Public Health team out and about this summer at an engagement event outside Wood Green Library to raise awareness about substance misuse.


### Learning to Cook Professionally at Rising Green Youth Hub

### Wood Green Community Diagnostic Centre Launch

The Wood Green Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC) is bringing diagnostic tests into the heart of Haringey. The centre was opened this year in the Mall @ Wood Green to make it easier for people to attend their healthcare appointments. Previously Haringey residents had to travel further for diagnostic tests than other residents in Barnet, Camden Enfield and Islington.

#### Shaping Wood Green Launch





The 'Shaping Wood Green' vision for the future of the area which was created in collaboration with local people was launched in July 2023 with a fantastic event at Clockwise Workspace. Residents, businesses, officers and stakeholders who took part in the forming of the vision came together to celebrate the exciting future of Wood Green.

#### Routes into Work Event at Dominion Church



Haringey Works, residents and businesses led a successful Careers and Jobs fair on Thursday 6 October at the Dominion Centre in Wood Green, with over 500+ residents seeking a career change, advice, or job opportunities. Employers (over 50+) were in attendance and included the likes of Tottenham Hotspur Foundation, TFL, NHS, Princes Trust, Fusion, as well as many other local businesses like Dusty Knuckle.

#### **Opportunity Haringey Event**





Opportunity Haringey is Haringey Council's Inclusive Economy Framework. It has been developed through listening to residents and businesses. It sets out how the council will work with local and strategic partners to create an inclusive, more resilient local economy where local businesses can grow and thrive and residents benefit from rewarding, well-paid work.

### Pioneering Urban Decarbonised Development at Wolves Lane






Co-designed and collaboratively constructed with Wolves Lane's diverse multi-generational community. Three new carbon negative buildings, set within an acre of biodiverse habitat are under construction. A class of CONEL College level 2 carpentry students attended a construction site tour in October, with other classes engaging with digital tours previously. Individuals and smaller groups have also undertaken hundreds of hours of urban eco building work experience on site, with some going on to gain skilled employment both at Wolves Lane and elsewhere.

#### Find Your Flaare Youth Enterprise Project

The Find Your Flaare project delivered a transformative 12 week entrepreneurial programme to 20 young people aged 13 to 17 at Rising Green youth hub. The programme sought to equip the cohort with essential business skills, entrepreneurial acumen, social media marketing strategies, branding expertise, and a boost in self-confidence. **Sponsored by Avanade** Technologies and expertly delivered by Please.



#### Russell's Hub Launch





After taking on the lease for a disused kiosk in Russell Park, Noel Park Big Local allocated a generous budget from its Local Trust funding to transform the space, installing a top of the range kitchen space that will guarantee the longevity of the cafe. Then, in summer 2023 the Russell's Hub Cafe opened its doors to paying customers and has become a focal point for the Noel Park Community, creating employment for five local residents along the way.
