Statutory Consultation

Proposed Zebra Crossing on Alexandra Road N22

Dear Resident or Business,

As part of this year's Road Danger Reduction Programme, the Council is proposing to introduce a zebra crossing on Alexandra Road near its junction with High Road N22. The proposed zebra crossing will provide a clearly defined crossing point and will give pedestrians the right of way over traffic, enabling them to cross the road safely, thereby improving road safety.

Details of the proposal are listed below and set out on the plan overleaf:

- Introduce a zebra crossing on Alexandra Road, including associated lighting equipment and road markings.
- Provide high skid resistant surface treatment on the approach to the zebra crossing.
- Remove obstructive tree (replacement tree to be planted at a suitable location)

In order to introduce the proposals and legally enforce their use, we are required to enter into a period of consultation known as Statutory Consultation. This is the legal part of the process and takes the form of a Public Notice advertised in the local press, London Gazette and visible locations within the area to inform the public of the Council's intentions.

The statutory consultation process normally runs for three weeks but given the approaching festive period, it will run for five weeks until **14 January 2026**. You can send us your objection or representation by scanning the QR code above or using the link to complete our online feedback form. Alternatively, you can use the enclosed Freepost feedback card. If you object to the scheme, please give reasons for your objection.

What Happens Next

Any objections or submissions will be considered by the Council before a decision is made. If the decision is made to implement the changes proposed, we will then send you a further letter informing you when works will commence on site.
