Statutory Consultation

Proposed Zebra Crossing on Craven Park Road, N15

Dear Resident or Business,

As part of this year's Road Danger Reduction Programme, the Council is proposing to introduce a zebra crossing on Craven Park Road near the junction with Leadale Road. The proposed zebra crossing will provide a clearly defined crossing point and will give pedestrians the right of way over traffic, enabling them to cross the road safely.

Details of the proposal are listed below and set out on the enclosed plan:

- Install a zebra crossing on Craven Park Road near the junction with Leadale Road, including appropriate lighting and road markings.
- Provide a pedestrian refuge island.
- Reduce the number of parking bays by approximately six to accommodate the new crossing.
- Apply high-friction surfacing on the approaches to the zebra crossing.

In order to introduce the proposals and legally enforce their use, we are required to enter into a period of consultation known as Statutory Consultation. This is the legal part of the process and takes the form of a Public Notice advertised in the local press, London Gazette and visible locations within the area to inform the public of the Council's intentions.

This letter marks the start of a three-week public and statutory consultation period and will run for three weeks until **18 February 2026**. The statutory consultation is a formal process whereby the proposals are advertised in the local press and allow a 21-day period for anyone wishing to object to the proposals. You can give us your views, comments, or objections by scanning the QR code above, or using the link to complete our online feedback form. Alternatively, you can use the enclosed Freepost feedback card. If you object to the scheme, please give reasons for your objection.

What Happens Next

Any objections or submissions will be considered by the Council before a decision is made. If the decision is made to implement the changes proposed, we will then send you a further letter informing you when works will commence on site.
