

DELIVERING A FAIRER GREENER HARINGEY

The coming year will see a record level of investment in Haringey to provide the services our residents rely on, and ensure our borough is clean, safe and welcoming for all. We are committed to building a Haringey where everyone can belong and thrive, and ensuring that vital resources go where they are needed most.

That means more than £220m to support residents who need help at the most challenging times via adults' and children's social care, and £43m on addressing the homelessness crisis. We are continuing to invest in our parks and green spaces, libraries and leisure centres. We are also incredibly proud to have delivered the first 1,000 new council homes, at council rents – with a further 2,000 on the way.

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We are working hard to ensure that we achieve maximum value for money through improving back-office efficiency, cutting the number of agency staff and reducing all non-essential spending.

These decisions are the result of tough choices. Due to historic government underfunding, in 2025/26 we have operated with around £143m less in real terms in core government funding than we did in 2010/11. We continue to operate with less, while demand for our services continues to rise, as does the cost of providing them.

The government was never going to be able to reverse more than a decade of austerity in one go, but we will see a much-needed uplift in funding next year of around £17m, which is welcome.

SHOW ME THE MONEY

By making every pound count and focusing support where it's needed most, we're building a fairer, greener and safer borough for everyone.

Your Council Tax makes up 41% of the money the council has to spend on services for residents and invest in our borough. The full budget is made up of Council Tax, business rates, grants from the government, income, and borrowing.

CONCESSIONARY FARES

Since 2022*, we have:

Protected the **Freedom Pass** for residents over **66**, ensuring they can continue to travel for free or at discounted rates on most public transport in London and on local buses across England.

RECYCLING AND WASTE

Collected **2.1 million refuse and recycling bins** each month, with 52 crews working daily (on average). Cleaned **370k kilometres** of roads each year.

ADULT SOCIAL CARE

Helped **4,000** residents over **65** and **3,600 adults** aged 18–64 each year. Opened the Roger Sylvester Centre, a pioneering mental health facility. Launched a co-produced Carers Strategy.

Since 2022, we have:

Filled 5,774 potholes, resurfaced **189 roads** and re-laid **114 footpaths**.

TACKLING HOMELESSNESS

Since 2022, we have:

Ended homeless stays for families in hotels. Brought **184** private empty homes back in use after council action. **Protected 20,133 renters** with council controls on rented homes.

CHILDREN'S SOCIAL CARE

Since 2022, we have:

Opened four family hubs in Wood Green, Northumberland Park, Muswell Hill and Seven Sisters. Our Children's Services were rated **Outstanding** for the first time, and our **SEND** services also achieved the **highest Ofsted rating**.

SCHOOLS

Since 2022, we have:

Achieved **99% of schools** being Ofsted-graded **good or outstanding**, including Haringey's alternative provision. Served **16,350 free school breakfasts** and **repaired 10 school roofs**.

LIBRARIES

Since 2022, we have:

Kept all nine of Haringey's **libraries open** and refurbished four. Co-created a **Libraries Strategy** that will enable our libraries to be **dynamic, inclusive and indispensable** in the years ahead.

CUSTOMER SERVICES

Since 2022, we have:

Answered over **220,000 phone calls** and seen **54,000 people** in person at our Customer Service Centres each year. Helped **24,866 households** to claim Council Tax relief and assisted **7,475 households** through the Haringey Support Fund.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Since 2022, we have:

Become the first council to **ban gambling advertising on our estate**. Supported over **2,000 people** with drug and alcohol issues and helped **1,200 residents** to **stop smoking**. More than **5,300 people** have taken part in **Haringey Health Walks**.

PARKS AND LEISURE

Since 2022, we have:

Improved **30 parks**, created **7 new playgrounds**, **renovated 9 playgrounds** and **planted 6,114 new trees**.

Brought **4 leisure centres** back into council management. **Upgraded the pools at Park Road** and started a major **gym refurbishment** at **Tottenham Green**.
