2.	SEND Inspection (Review and update from Chair). The Chair advised the Board that on Monday 15 January'2024, notification was received for the Joint Area SEND Inspection by Ofsted/CQC. This will be for a period of three weeks concluding on 2 Feb 2024. The Inspectors from Ofsted/CQC will track the journey of Haringey's children and young people with SEND, across our systems and services. The Chair thanked the Team for their continuing work in overseeing the inspection. Senior leaders will give a contextual presentation at the Inspectors introductory meeting of the SEND Transformation Journey which will involve a short video. 3.	 Elevated Youth – SEND Youth Forum [Update] – Jackie Difolco - Noted - Karen Douglas, Youth Engagement Co-Ordinator will be leaving the LA to seek other opportunities. In the interim, Lakeisha Crawford and Jayden Boyce will be supporting. Takeover day – 6-8 young people with SEND participated. [Refer to the link for a full report]. Youth Takeover Day 2023: Championing Young Voices Haringey Council Other work Elevated Youth have been doing include: Taking part in a session with Sanjuro Martial Arts and providing feedback on the experience for SEND young people Identifying retailers and restaurants for the discount card attached to the Disability Register. 6 members have completed recruitment and training and will be involved in recruitment processes for staff. 40% of young people who took part in the FLAARE programme at Rising Green have SEND. A great experience for young people to develop their entrepreneurial and business skills with products on sale. A nomination for the innovative work Elevated Youth is doing has been submitted for a national award.

	Short breaks and overnight respite care provision:			
	 Respite, the lack of overnight stays is becoming a dire issue with some parents. Lizzy has been meeting with the team regarding providers as they are not able to identify any specific ones for this area. 			
	 SENDASS – Sarah Miller – respite processes and the systems – Agreed to share the issues raised which are being identified via casework and the helpline. Note: Cllr Brabazon - The Brook School facilitates the summer play schemes for four weeks via 			
	 HAF. Note: Bev Hendricks: Officers are aware of the situation which families are encountering with the overnight respite. An interim solution is being crafted whilst a long term one is confirmed. This is a key priority for our families to understand the detail and the efforts, sharing via a range of methods which are available to us to restore their hope as we develop our own respite service.

7.	 SEND Executive Performance Report [Noting]. Noted – for 10 consecutive months, the figure for EHCP statutory assessments has been above 80%, against the national average of 60%. Quality of plans and Annual Reviews has improved and the dedicated QA support from the audit team can be evidenced. 			
	 Karel Stevens-Lee: Speech and Language – graduated response is starting to have an effect, we are seeing a small increase in discharge of children requiring specialist support. Wait times for Autism assessments - Ruth Doak – A noted rise of children that has gone into reception, with pressure on the families and young people for their initial assessment to be completed. Is there a plan and what are we doing to fix this?
