Entry Requirements

A minimum of 5 GCSE's Grade A* - C or Grade 4 and above, including Maths and English Language.

You are not eligible for this scheme if you currently hold or are working towards a qualification at the same or higher level in a related subject or have already studied content from the qualification for this scheme.

Applicants holding the following will not be eligible to apply:

- Level 3 Apprenticeship in Engineering or Level 3 NVQ Certificate or Diploma in any Engineering discipline
- Level 3 Knowledge qualification in Rail Engineering

You must turn 18 years of age by Sunday 7th March 2021 to be eligible for this scheme.
