What is Intensive Supervision and Surveillance (ISS)?

Haringey Youth Justice Service (YJS)



What is ISS?

- ISS is part of a Court Order or could be part of your Bail conditions.
- It is given to you instead of you going to prison.
- It is given for more serious offences.
- · You will have to do activities that support you.
- Each week you will get a timetable which will show you what you need to do.



What can it include?

- When you have ISS, you are supervised (managed) by the YJS.
- You will meet with the YJS several times (usually daily) each week.
- In these meetings you might be with your case worker or other people such as drug workers or health workers.
- If you are in education this will count towards your hours. You will also do activities at the weekend such as 'reparation' or reporting at a police station.
- You will have a curfew (times you have to be at home) and an electronic tag to make sure you stick to your curfew hours.



How long does it last for?

- ISS part of your order lasts for 3-6 months. But your order will last longer than this.
- Bail will last until the Court changes your conditions or until your Court case has ended.

Where do I need to go?



- Your meetings will usually take place at 38 Station Road, Wood Green, N22 7BF, or at another centre in the community.
- Your YJS case worker will let you know where. You need to let your case manager know where you feel safe.

Who is involved?



- You will meet with a YJS worker who will talk to you and your parent/carer.
- You will agree a plan to support you with what you feel you need to stop getting into more trouble.
- Your YJS case worker and the Haringey Youth Justice Service are here to help you stay out of trouble.

What are the rules?



- ✓ Follow the rules in your contract
- ✓ Go to all of your sessions with your case worker and you have to be on time, unless you have a good reason
- Tell us if you change your address or phone number
- ✓ Be polite to case workers and all Haringey Youth Justice Service staff
- ➤ You must not have any drugs or alcohol before your appointment
- ★ You must not bring any friends to appointments
